This year will be my 26th year as a counselor at the Lake Louise choir camp. Last year the staff marked my 25th anniversary by giving me a beautiful painting which is hung in my office. You may ask what keeps me going back for so many years. I'm not quite sure how to answer that question.

The lake, which is crystal clear, has a way of drawing you to its water's edge to renew your soul. The staff works together as a whole to make the camping experience for the campers the best it can be. They work at bringing God to the campers in ways that speak to them. The schedule for each day includes fun activities that the campers can count on.

The daily schedule is full. Rise and shine is at 7:00, followed by optional activities for those who are morning people. Breakfast is at 8:00. Morning worship with our very own praise band is followed by morning choir practice, which is followed by contract classes.

You may be wondering what contract classes are. Each counselor facilitates one class either in the morning or the afternoon. The class can be anything from sports games to knitting, to coloring mandalas by the beach, or my favorite, Yooper Class. I teach the Yooper Class. The campers learn a little history of the UP, some of the awesome sights in the UP, and a little bit of the Yooper cuisine.

Lunch is at noon, followed by my favorite part of the day—rest time. After rest time we have a time for the cabins to have their own devotion time. This is followed by another choir practice and contract classes. After the afternoon contract class, the campers have supervised activity time where they can go swimming, play sports games, play cards, call home, or relax. Supper is at 5:30. After supper is an activity called "Free Expression." This is an activity where a camper can show off their talent whether it is singing a song, playing an instrument, doing a skit or as one camper did - burping the alphabet. Each evening there is a special activity planned for the campers and counselors. It may be a guest performer or a special activity. Vespers follow the evening's activity. It is held down by the water at the outdoor chapel.

Because the campers range in age from 9-18 we have 3 different bedtimes. The youngest go to bed first, followed by the middle school campers, and then the high school campers. While waiting for their turn to go to bed, the high school campers play games, listen to music, and relax.

On the last day of camp, which is Saturday, the campers put on a concert for their friends and family. It includes the music they have been practicing all week. It is one heck of a concert. I am always amazed at the quality of the music they perform.

Did I answer the question about why I keep going back when it sounds like so much work? Let me tell you. I go back because of the kids. I go back because each year God blesses me and fills my spirit. I go back to be with my other Christian Community. I go back because of the music. I go back for the fun. You may want to try it sometime.
